### **SIR FRANCIS DRAKE:**

A Pirate and a Knight

Francis Drake was an experienced and daring sailor, who started exploring the sea at age 13. During his life, Drake became one of the most notorious men in Protestant England. Under the reign of Queen Elizabeth I, he became the first Englishman to sail around the world. During his journeys, Drake raided Spanish Catholic ships, plundered silver, spices, treasure, and land. His successful battles against the Spanish helped England become a major sea power, and he was knighted by the queen for his valiant efforts.

Drake's Raid on St. Augustine

On June 7, 1586, Drake attacked St. Augustine with 2,300 Englishmen and 23 warships. At the time, St. Augustine was serving as an official military outpost of the Spanish Empire that was used as a port for traveling treasure fleets. Upon their arrival at Anastasia Island, Drake and his fleet fired cannons, stormed through the streets, looted, and burned the city to the ground. The people of St. Augustine were forced to flee, leaving behind their paychest of treasures.
